Public Safety Levy

Explanation

In response to this shortfall, the Committee spear headed a grassroots campaign to assess community support for enhanced police services. The outcome was the establishment of the first public safety levy in 2022, which was set at **\$1.38 per thousand dollars** of assessed value and received robust support from the community.

Special Issues

The City contracts with the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office to provide a full suite of police services. These services include continuous patrols, investigative work, traffic management, and initiatives to bolster school safety. This contract has enabled the City to leverage economies of scale, ensuring residents benefit from the resources of a larger police force while maintaining a conservative budget.

Financial Impact

As we approach November 2024, it is crucial to note that the public safety levy, which has been instrumental in funding these services for the past five years, is due to expire. City staff have been actively engaged in an ongoing educational campaign to ensure residents are well-informed about the funding of their police services and the cost-saving benefits of our contract with the sheriff's office.

Recommendation

This evening, the staff will elaborate on our educational efforts and explore ways in which the Committee can contribute to raising awareness among the citizens of Happy Valley regarding the significance of the upcoming levy that underpins our police services.
