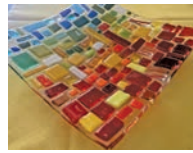

Tippi Toes is a children's dance program that offers a variety of engaging classes, such as ballet, tap, and jazz. The classes are designed to be fun and age appropriate, and they help children develop confidence, coordination, and a love for movement. Tippi Toes also creates a positive and nurturing environment where kids can experience joy and express themselves creatively.

With locations across the United States, Tippi Toes (East Portland) is owned by husband-and-wife Amber Pedersen and Stephen Griffin. Their goal in bringing Tippi Toes to Happy Valley is to make dance an accessible and affordable option for youth who want to explore storytelling through dance and learn more about the artform. They also hope to bring forth the comprehensive benefits to pursuing dance. Not only does it offer physical exercise, but it can improve memory, increase attention and processing speed, and boost imaginative play.

A mom of four school-aged children herself, Amber knows just how important it is to have access to recreational activities, especially ones that can be done indoors and throughout the year. She believes Tippi Toes is a great way to help kids and families stay active and even become part of a larger community. "Our instructors are diligent in connecting with their dancers," she says, "and they ensure each one knows they are valued."



She has seen students return for subsequent sessions and continue to build relationships

all while building their self-esteem and sense of self. "From what we have seen, once a dancer starts in a class, they don't want to stop coming! Knowing that the children are loving class and want to continue brings so much joy to our lives. More importantly, it demonstrates the impact Tippi Toes is having within the local community."

Unique to Tippi Toes is the program's specialty of writing and producing their own music and choreographed dances. Everything about the curriculum is developmentally appropriate for each age group and includes a lot of follow-along fun that ensures even the youngest of dancers can be successful. Students gain a true fundamental understanding of dance techniques through lively and skill-based activities that can easily be built upon and refined as they progress. Partnering with Happy Valley Parks and Recreation,



says Amber, has been a great way to expand Tippi Toes' reach and share the importance of dance with both kids and their families.

Tippi Toes classes are currently offered through Happy Valley Parks and Recreation throughout the year. Classes and activities are geared towards youth ages 18 months to 12 years and there are a variety of formats to choose from.

As a Happy Valley Parks and Recreation partner, local businesses have a unique opportunity to showcase their work with the support and encouragement of the City. Recognizing that small businesses are the backbone of the local economy, Parks and Rec staff are excited to find ways to bring the talents of our community members to the forefront

Oktoberfest in Happy Valley

The origin of Oktoberfest dates back to the early 1800s, when Crown Prince Ludwig of Bavaria married Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen. The royal wedding was a lavish affair that lasted for several days, featuring food, drinks, and horse racing. The celebration was so popular that it became an annual tradition.

Today, Oktoberfest is celebrated in many cities across the world, with oompah music, scrumptious fare, and steins of cold beer. Since 2019, Happy Valley has hosted its own version of the rousing German festival, in collaboration with local businesses.



Fun for the whole family

Kids can make a selection from the pumpkin patch, visit the petting zoo, and even climb aboard a fire truck. Crafts and community booths will also be available to help keep the little ones busy with hands-on activities like pumpkin decorating and games. Just make sure you're there when the event officially begins as Mayor Tom Ellis taps the traditional firkin (wooden keg) to get the festival going.

A food extravaganza
