TOPIC: Becoming Bodywise: How to Tap Into Your Body's Wisdom to Live and Lead with Authentic Alignment

MEgan brought her unique approach to whole-self well-BEing and leadership from her 35 years of experience as a physical therapist with training in interpersonal neurobiology, and somatic psychology.

- Gear 3 Freeze, Fold

She went on to share the A, B, C's of a BE ME Break:

- Authentic Alignment
- Bodylanguage of BEing
- Check-in

The session went deep as MEgan took the group through a range of exercises that worked the audiences physical and mental state of being.

February HVBA Meeting: CITY AND COUNTY UPDATES

City of Happy Valley - Steve Campbell, Director Community Services/Public Safety

- The city responded to the recent storm helping residents chain-up, having crews work to clear streets of abandoned cars utilizing a new tow approach. The tow company costs less, are towed locally, and even provided assistance to those stranded. City Public Works crews made an effort to sweep streets of sand immediately after the icy conditions passed. Did anyone notice the weather message on speed signs?
- Save the date: <u>Paws in the Park</u>: Saturday, May 31st, 11 am 3pm at Happy Valley Park.
 Get ready for a pawsome day dedicated to our furry friends!

Happy Valley Police - Chief Rich Sheldon

- A task force of local law enforcement crew worked along Sunnyside, 212 and local school zones in an effort to curb speeding on Friday, Feb. 21st. The task force included 15 officers providing an equivalent of more than 75+ additional hours of enforcement coverage.
- The new overnight Sergeant has started with a goal of always having two supervisors on at all times.

Clackamas Fire District - Izak Hamilton, Public Information Officer

- The recent wind storm resulted in a tree falling on a vehicle. Responding crews were able to remove the injured motorist and passenger within 4 minutes..
- 2025 YTD fire calls are at 228 calls, up versus 2024
- Blue Heron paper-mill blaze in Oregon City probably caused by 'makeshift stoves' used by homeless people. Clackamas Fire is working with the property owners for demolition.
- Clackamas Fire is working to change the reporting of fires to include "property saved". Gains can be attributed to increased staffing and new equipment from the passed levy.
- Operation Santa Clause 2024 provided 5,000+ toys and 9,000+ pounds of food

NCSD Update - Curtis Long, Communications & Community Relations Director

- Student Care Cards were distributed by students of local HV schools.
- NCSD at 2 snow days YTD. There are 3 days built in before make-up days would happen.
- 2025-26 School calendar to be presented at the Feb. 26th NCSD Board Meeting

SPEAKER: Molly Hogan,
Executive Director
Welcome Home Coalition



SESSION TOPIC: Ways that Public Investments are Helping All Our Neighbors Have a Place to Call Home and Ways We Can Improve.

Molly grew up throughout the West Coast and has lived in Oregon for almost 10 years. She holds a master's degree in public policy from Mills College in Oakland, California. She has a background of being a small business owner, providing direct service for unhoused youth, non-profit management as well as working in local, state, and federal government agencies.

Since 2022, she has been grateful to advocate with the Welcome Home Coalition for empathetic and cost-effective solutions to our collective shortage of affordable housing and resulting homelessness crisis.

Get To Know:

Patrick Sheehan HVBA Meeting Coordinator

Drawing from his tenure in the Oregon State Legislature, Patrick brought his experiences and insights into our community's economic health, infrastructure, and education projects to the role as Meeting Coordinator, where he has served for the past 6 years.

His full-time professional role is as a licensed Oregon Realtor with Better Homes & Gardens Real Estate focusing on executive homes in Happy Valley, West Linn, Lake Oswego, Clackamas County and beyond. Patrick has become heavily involved in the community through philanthropic organizations and political connections. From these roles that he has developed a strong network to draw from.



Knowing that HVBA Members come from many different industries, Patrick takes this into consideration when scheduling speakers. There is a balancing act for speaker topics. Interest in the community, relevance of the topic, and objectivity of the information must be useful information of general interest. If it's narrow in its focus, the speaker may not be an ideal fit.



With a range of speakers that present to the HVBA Members, there sometimes is a common skill set that successful presenters have achieving a strong presentation. It often starts with having a conversational tone. As for the content, bringing up something that people may not have known existed is usually of interest to the audience.

Drawing from other past speakers, Patrick recalls Eric Fruits as one of the most well received in the last few years. He's a senior economist for Cascade Policy Institute and gave a wildly entertaining and informative presentation of an economic forecast a couple of years ago. People really liked it, and it applied to everyone in the room.

Having a source that can address immediate community issues is good. Our March speaker, Molly Hogan, Executive Director of the Welcome Home Coalition and I met through the Metro Supportive Housing Work group. Ms. Hogan advocates for all the subsidized housing services in the tri-county area. There sometimes are concerns that housing projects of that type sometimes result in strains on public safety. Having this presented to the HVBA Membership would be useful to provide some perspective on the benefits to the community rather than just the criticisms.


